



## [Deacon King Kong by James McBride](#)

From the author of the National Book Award-winning *The Good Lord Bird*, comes a wise and witty novel about what happens to the witnesses of a shooting.




## [Devil in a Blue Dress by Walter Mosley](#)


## [IQ by Joe Ide](#)

A resident of one of LA's toughest neighborhoods uses his blistering intellect to solve the crimes the LAPD ignores.




## [The Jim Chee Mysteries by Tony Hillerman](#)

## [My Sister, the Serial Killer by Oyinkan Braithwaite](#)






### [Skeleton God by Eliot Pattison](#)


### [They All Fall Down by Rachel Howzell Hall](#)


### [Three-fifths by John Vercher](#)


### [When No One Is Watching by Alyssa Cole](#)
