



<u>Deacon King Kong by James</u> <u>McBride</u>

From the author of the National Book Awardwinning The Good Lord Bird, comes a wise and witty novel about what happens to the witnesses of a shooting.




<u>The Jim Chee Mysteries</u> by Tony Hillerman

Officer Jim Chee of the Navajo Tribal Police is forced to use all of his powers of deduction and insight to extricated himself from a deadly series of events.




<u>Devil in a Blue Dress</u> by Walter Mosley


<u>The Other Americans by Laila</u> Lalami




Skeleton God by Eliot Pattison


Three-fifths by John Vercher


When No One Is Watching by Alyssa Cole
