



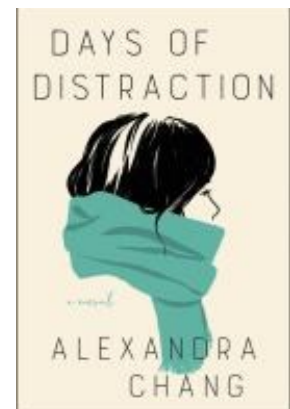
Big Girl Panties by Stephanie Evanovich

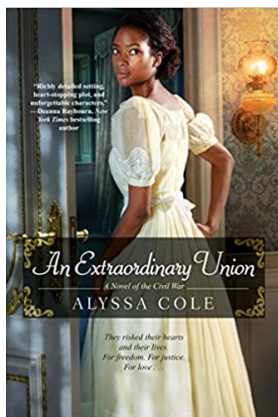
The Bride Test by Helen Hoang

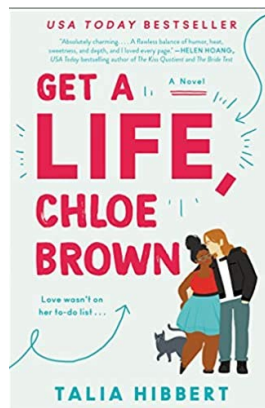
Days of Distraction by Alexandra Chang

Get a Life, Chloe Brown by Talia Hibbert

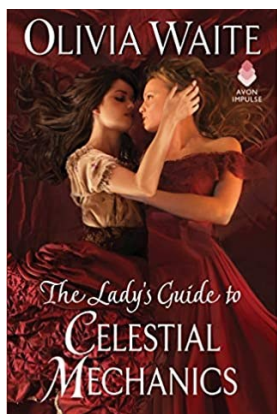

Island Affair by Priscilla Oliveras

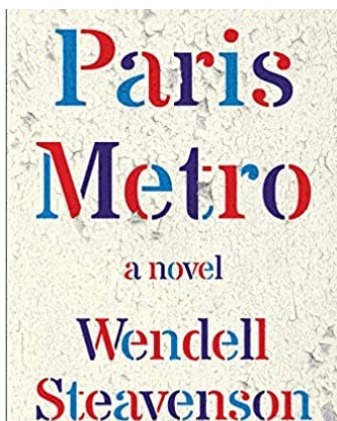

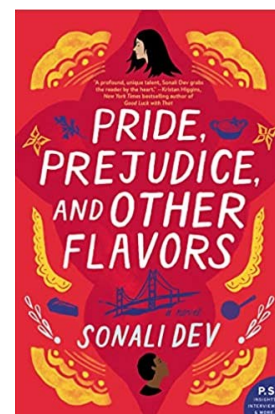
[The Lady's Guide to Celestial Mechanics by Olivia Waite](#)

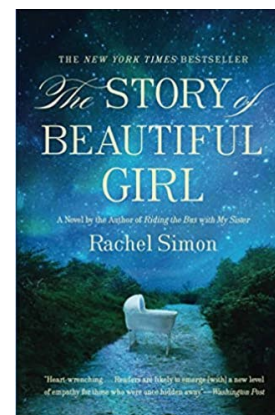
[The Plum Tree by Ellen Marie Wiseman](#)
