



Bay Pimentel, Annette. j323.37 BAYPIME


Experience the true story of lifelong activist Jennifer Keelan-Chaffins and her participation in the Capitol Crawl in this inspiring autobiographical picture book.




CHARLIE & FROG

Charlie stumbles upon a mystery but must learn American Sign Language to keep up with Frog, a deaf girl who wants to help solve it.




OUT OF MY MIND

Considered by many to be mentally retarded, a brilliant, impatient fifth-grader with cerebral palsy discovers a technological device that will allow her to speak for the first time.




LOVED THE VIOLIN

Difficult obstacles, including immigration, poverty, and disabling polio, that challenged Itzhak's musical development into a virtuoso.




THE SOMEDAY BIRDS




EMMANUEL'S DREAM

Born in Ghana, West Africa, with one deformed leg, he was dismissed by most people--but not by his mother, who taught him to reach for his dreams.




MASCOT

After a car accident paralyzed Noah, he is scared he'll never feel like his old self again. He'll have to face the things that are keeping him on the sidelines if he ever wants to move




NOT SO DIFFERENT
